# 10. Close with a Memorable Statement

End the interview by reiterating your excitement and passion for the role. This leaves a lasting impression.

Example: "Thank you for this opportunity. Speaking with you has made me even more excited about contributing to your team. I'm genuinely passionate about this role and can't wait to bring my skills and enthusiasm to your organization."

Passion isn't about how loud or animated you are—it's about sincerity, preparation, and connection. By researching the company, sharing authentic stories, and demonstrating your commitment to the role, you can convey your passion effectively.
