- **Use language that reflects humility and gratitude, even when discussing your achievements.**

Know Your “Why”

Faith-based interviews often touch on deeper motivations.

- **Be prepared to articulate why you’re drawn to this role beyond salary or status.**
- **Share how your faith influences your work ethic, leadership style, or approach to challenges.**
- **If appropriate, mention how you hope to grow spiritually and professionally in this position.**

Follow Up with Gratitude

A thank-you note is more than etiquette—it’s an extension of your character.

- **Send a personalized message within 24 hours of the interview.**
- **Express appreciation not just for the opportunity, but for the conversation and connection.**
- **Consider including a brief verse or blessing if the organization is faith-based.**

Additional Tips to Deepen Your Preparation

1. Study the Organization’s Mission and Values

Especially in faith-based settings, alignment with the organization’s spiritual mission is crucial.

- **Review their website, social media, and any published materials.**
- **Reflect on how your personal values intersect with theirs.**
- **Prepare examples of how you’ve lived out similar values in past roles or volunteer work.**

2. Prepare a Testimony of Professional Faith

This isn’t about preaching—it’s about sharing how your faith shapes your work.

- **Think of a moment when your faith helped you navigate a challenge at work.**

- Share how spiritual disciplines (prayer, service, integrity) influence your daily tasks.
- Keep it concise and relevant to the role you're applying for.

3. Practice Active Listening as a Spiritual Discipline

- Focus fully on the interviewer's words—don't just wait for your turn to speak.
- Reflect back what you've heard to show understanding.
