

Grace for the Outcome:

A 3-Day Devotional for Post-Interview Reflections

Day 1 – Trusting God’s Timing

Scripture:

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

— Jeremiah 29:11 (NIV)

Reflection:

Waiting after an interview can be filled with anxiety and uncertainty. But God’s plans for us are good, even when we cannot see the outcome. Trusting His timing means releasing our need for control and resting in His sovereign care. Remember, God’s schedule is perfect—even when ours feels rushed or stalled.

Prayer:

Lord, help me to trust Your timing. Calm my anxious heart and remind me that Your plans for me are good. Teach me to wait patiently, knowing You are working all things for my good.

Day 2 – Finding Peace in Surrender

Scripture:

"Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."

— 1 Peter 5:7 (NIV)

Reflection:

It’s natural to feel nervous or doubtful after an important interview. But God invites us to surrender our worries to Him completely. When we release our anxiety, we make room for His peace to fill us. This peace guards our hearts and minds, helping us to stay grounded in faith instead of fear.

Prayer:

Father, I cast my worries and fears onto You today. Help me to release control and rest in Your care. Fill me with Your peace that surpasses all understanding.

Day 3 – Holding on to Hope

Scripture:

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

— Romans 15:13 (NIV)

Reflection:

Hope is an anchor for the soul, especially during times of waiting. God doesn't leave us alone in our uncertainty—He fills us with joy and peace so we can overflow with hope. This hope is not wishful thinking but a confident expectation rooted in God's faithfulness. Hold on to this hope as you await the next step.

Prayer:

God of hope, fill me with Your joy and peace today. Strengthen my faith so I may trust You fully, even when I cannot see the outcome. Help me to remain grounded in Your love, no matter what comes.
