

Wisdom in Preparation:

A 3-Day Devotional on Discernment and Diligence

Day 1 – Seeking God’s Guidance

Scripture:

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

— Proverbs 3:5–6 (NIV)

Reflection:

Preparation begins with seeking God’s wisdom. When we try to navigate life and decisions relying only on our own insight, we risk missing God’s perfect plan. Discernment is rooted in trust—trust that God sees the whole picture and will guide us in the right direction. Start your preparation by surrendering your plans to Him.

Prayer:

Lord, I confess my tendency to rely on my own understanding. Teach me to seek Your guidance first in all things. Help me trust Your timing and direction, even when the path seems unclear.

Day 2 – Diligence in Action

Scripture:

"The plans of the diligent lead to profit as surely as haste leads to poverty."

— Proverbs 21:5 (NIV)

Reflection:

Discernment must be paired with diligence. God honors those who prepare carefully and work faithfully. Hasty decisions often lead to mistakes, but patience and thoroughness yield blessing. Wisdom involves taking action—prayerfully, purposefully, and persistently. Your diligence is a testimony of faith in God’s promises.

Prayer:

Father, give me the strength and discipline to prepare well. Help me work diligently without rushing or becoming discouraged. Let my efforts reflect faithfulness to You.

Day 3 – Confidence in God’s Provision

Scripture:

"Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established."

— Proverbs 16:3 (ESV)

Reflection:

After seeking guidance and working diligently, rest confidently in God's provision. Preparation is not about controlling every outcome but about faithfully doing our part and trusting God with the rest. When we commit our plans to Him, He establishes our steps and opens doors. Faith and wisdom walk hand in hand.

Prayer:

Lord, I commit my preparation and plans to You. Help me rest in Your sovereignty and provision. Let my confidence come from You alone, knowing You work all things for good.
