

How to Shine on a Screening Call: A Christian Job Seeker's Guide

When you're invited to a screening call, pause and thank God — because this is already a sign of His favor. The recruiter isn't calling you randomly. They've seen your résumé, noticed your qualifications, and believe you might be the right fit. In many cases, they're already rooting for you. *"A man's gift makes room for him and brings him before great men."* (Proverbs 18:16)

Your gifts have opened this door. Now your job is to walk through it with confidence, clarity, and grace.

But as believers, we don't rely on comparison — we rely on calling. So how do you stand out in a way that honors God, reflects excellence, and shows you're the perfect fit?

Here's the secret: Be clear. Be genuinely interested. Know the company deeply. And let your light shine. Jesus said, *"Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works..."* (Matthew 5:16). A screening call is one of the simplest places to do exactly that.

To help you shine, here are four powerful, polished sentences that Christian job seekers can use — sentences that demonstrate preparation, humility, confidence, and purpose.

1. "I've been following [Company Name]'s work on [Specific Project/Initiative], and I'm really impressed by..."

This shows genuine interest and initiative — qualities Scripture celebrates. *"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord..."* (Colossians 3:23)

When you show that you've done your homework, you communicate diligence. You're not just looking for any job — you're seeking the right assignment.

2. "My experience in [Relevant Skill] helped me achieve [Quantifiable Result] at my previous role, and I believe it would translate well to the [Specific Responsibility] you mentioned."

This highlights your God-given abilities and the fruit they've produced. *"You will know them by their fruits."* (Matthew 7:16)

Recruiters love measurable results. They love clarity. They love candidates who can connect past success to future contribution. This sentence does all three — without sounding boastful. It simply acknowledges the stewardship of your skills.

3. "I'm particularly interested in [Aspect of the Role] because it aligns with my desire to [Career Goal]."

This shows purpose — and purpose is powerful. *"Write the vision; make it plain..."* (Habakkuk 2:2)

When you articulate why the role matters to you, you demonstrate alignment with the company's mission and clarity about your own. People follow purpose-driven individuals. Recruiters remember them.

4. "I've reviewed the job description and believe my qualifications in [Skills] make me a strong candidate. I'm happy to explain, but I'm also eager to learn more about the challenges and opportunities of the position."

This shows preparation, humility, and enthusiasm — a Christlike blend. *"Be quick to listen..."* (James 1:19)

You're confident but teachable. Skilled but curious. Ready but willing to grow. Recruiters love candidates who show both competence and humility.

Why These Sentences Work

These sentences make your answers:

- Concise — you speak with clarity, not confusion.
- Coherent — your thoughts flow with purpose.

But more importantly, these qualities reflect the excellence God calls us to walk in. *"Daniel distinguished himself... because an excellent spirit was in him."* (Daniel 6:3)
